

Chief Holzschuh said yes, ma'am. Chief Holzschuh said they have three (3) officers and the fourth is certified tonight. He said they had two (2) in training. Now they have three (3) fully training and one almost trained.

Councilman Trammell said part of the road she is talking about on Lady Bird is like Ennis Speedway. He said the way people come around that S curve they gut it to see how fast they can get down to the stop sign that has been taken down. He said someone could get hurt really bad on that road — there are no speed bumps or anything. It's about a mile long and it is straight as an arrow.

Council Woman Steele said she would love to have a radar gun.

Council Member Jenkins said when she they turn off of Lady Bird onto their road. She said when they are at their horse arena you can heard them turn off of Lady Bird and by the time they hit her second gate they are going 40 to 50 miles per hour.

Chief Holzschuh said he will address it.

Council Member Steele said something needs to be done about the dogs.

Chief Holzschuh said that is the number one call he has.

Council Woman Steele said she loves dogs but she knows for a fact until they get three (3) or four (4) tickets they are going to keep on doing it. She said when they start getting \$300 or \$400 fines then they might do something about it.

Councilman Trammell asked Chief Holzschuh would he need for the Police Department to help him with this issue with the animals. He said he didn't know of anything that he knows of.

Chief Holzschuh said there is no animal control in the city. He said his officers are ordered to not touch animals. He said because if you catch one what are you going to do with it? He said he had one (1) officer drive all the way to Fort Worth to drop a dog off. He said he isn't going to have an officer drive to Fort Worth to drop a dog off that's not happening anymore. He said he is just making a practical example of we can't do what they need to do.

Councilman Trammell asked what they need to address as the council and as a city to help to alleviate some of these problems.

Chief Holzschuh said he has been working on some solutions and it's going to take some time. He said he would bring it to them as soon as he has it set up.

Joe Polino said before he speaks he will defer it to former Mayor Stokes because she wanted to speak before him.

Lynda Stokes said she had a question on animals to Billie and to all of them. She asked is it true in the State of Texas you have to have rabies shot for your dogs.

Council Woman Jenkins said yes it is — it is a law. She said the reason she knows that is that she travels with her dogs and if she is pulled over — she just having a rabies tag on her collar is not proof enough. She has to keep a copy of her rabies certificate in the glove box.

Lynda Stokes said it is State law when you are sworn in you are sworn to uphold the laws of State also and this County are you not. She asked then why and sir I'm going to direct this to you.

Mayor Pro Tem Basham said Rule of Order. He said they are off the Police Report.

Lynda Stokes said they are talking about dogs. She asked why the Chief of Police — why would you tell one (1) citizen -

Chief Holzschuh said he has never said that. He said he is not on trial but he would not say that.

Lynda Stokes said that's why she wanted to ask him why he would say that.

Chief Holzschuh said he hasn't.

Lynda Stokes said so every Council Person up that should have rabies tags for their dogs.

Chief Holzschuh said he was not going to try the Council Members. He said she knew what's going on.

Joe Polino said he would like to make a suggestion to the Chief. He said when he was the Chief of Police is the best place to sit on that road is to back into Council Women Steele's drive way.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Basham to approve the Consent Agenda. Motion was seconded by Councilman Trammell, motion carried 5-0.

Motion was made by Councilman Basham to remove the City Attorney for cause under Texas Local Government Code. He said he was doing Item A & B out of order if Mayor Hunter didn't mind.

Mayor Hunter said he didn't mind.

Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Basham that they remove the City Attorney for cause under Texas Local Government Code, Chapter 22.077 Sub-Chapter A for misconduct and malfeasance effective immediately. Motion was seconded by Councilman Trammell.

Mayor Hunter said before they vote he said Walt Leonard had the option to be heard.

Walt Leonard said yes he would like to say quite a few things about this. He said first of all what does misconduct and malfeasances mean. He said there is no definition of that and no indication on what he can say in terms of being able to respond to it. He said this entire process has been fraught with absolutely high handed and basically trial by ambush overtures which are very disturbing to him. He said he presumes everyone on the Council has seen his letter from earlier last week where he pointed out a variety of things which has been done that are incorrect. He said 22.077A those are not the misconduct or malfeasances is not mentioned at all in the letter notifying him only there would be a hearing and nothing else. He had not heard what the charges are, what the reasons are, what the problems might have been. He said he did not receive this letter — this particular letter he received at 2:15 this afternoon. He received a copy of the letter on Friday morning. He said he mentioned in this letter he had been tied up in
